Information and consent declaration
Regarding MR (magnetic resonance) examination

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Highly esteemed patient,

Your attending physician has sent you for magnetic resonance (MR) examination to our Institution. The MR examination is carried out in a magnetic field; it involves no radiance load and is innocuous.

The process of the examination

You lie on a convenient bed which carries you at the start of the examination into a test device with an inlet diameter of 70-100 cm. The length of the examination is usually between 30 and 60 minutes, during which at 4-12 minute intervals loud, rapping noise can be heard from the MR equipment. This noise is a sound generated by the normal operation of the examination equipment.

For the sake of a successful examination it is of the utmost importance that you should lie during the whole length of the examination calmly, perfectly motionless, and breathe evenly, quietly. Wee see and hear you during the whole length of the MR examination; you may signal any eventual problem and, should you have a reason, you may at time require the interruption of the examination.

For the sake of more accurate and reliable finding in some cases it might be necessary to effect intravenous injection or special MR contrast materials. The MR contrast materials can be applied securey, at very small risks. Slight contrast material reactions (bitter or metallic taste in the mounth, temporary itching of the skin, exanthema etc.) occur very seldom. More grave, perilous contrast material reactions occur extremely seldom (1x for 40000 cases). For the application of contrast material your consent is required.

Stressing it once more that the MR examination is basically harmless and safe, we have to draw your attention expressively to the following: in the MR examination room there is a very intensive magnetic field. Before you enter this room, we have to know, whether you have in your body metallic materials or certain devices which might disturb the MR examination or may constitute serious risk for you. We request you, for your safety and the safety of the examining personnel, to read carefully and answer accurately the following questions. (Please indicate the appropriate answer by a cross).
